Background: CLOSUP

- The Center for Local, State, and Urban Policy (CLOSUP) was founded at the University of Michigan's Ford School of Public Policy in 2001
- A small research center with a core staff of permanent employees and additional student research staff and faculty working on a wide variety of research projects, events, & courses
- The Center's primary mission is to conduct and support applied academic research that informs local, state, and urban policy issues, both in Michigan and beyond





Background: The MPPS

- A census survey all 1,856 Michigan counties, cities, villages, and townships
- Respondents chief elected and appointed officials
- Administered online and via hardcopy
- **Topics** wide range, such as fiscal health, budget priorities, roads, public safety, economic development, intergovernmental cooperation, service privatization, employee policies, labor unions, environmental sustainability, Great Lakes, citizen engagement, much more.





MPPS is not a typical opinion poll

- 70+% response rates
- Transparency
 - -- Questionnaires online
 - -- Pre-run data tables online
 - -- Sharing of (anonymized) datasets with other researchers
- Expert advisors on questionnaire content
- Research partnership with Michigan local government associations
 - -- MAC, MML, & MTA
- Borrowing from other proven sources such as NLC and ICMA





































Percentage of local officials who say Michigan is headed in "the right direction"








Percentage of local officials who say Michigan is headed in "the right direction"

(by jurisdiction size)








Percentage of local officials who say Michigan is headed in "the right direction"

(by jurisdiction's urban-rural status)
















































Percentage of local officials who say Governor Snyder's performance is "excellent" or "good"








Percentage of local officials who say Governor Snyder's performance is "excellent" or "good"







Percentage of local officials who say Governor Snyder's performance is "excellent" or "good"








Local officials more positive on Governor Snyder than citizens are

(by Spring 2018 MPPS (officials) vs. Winter 2017 SOSS (citizens))










How would you **rate** the way **the Michigan Legislature** is performing its job?








How would you **rate** the way **the Michigan Legislature** is performing its job?










Percentage of local officials who say the Michigan Legislature's performance is "excellent" or "good"








Percentage of local officials who say the Michigan Legislature's performance is "excellent" or "good"

Michigan local officials' views on the state's direction, the Governor, and the Legislature Summary

- For the second straight year, the percentage of Michigan's local leaders who are optimistic about the state's direction has increased. Statewide, over half (56%) believe Michigan is headed in the right direction, while a third (33%) say the state is off on the wrong track. Republicans officials are much more likely to be optimistic.
- Local leaders' positive job approval ratings for Governor Rick Snyder have risen for the second year in row as well, to 52%. But although 68% of Republican officials say he's doing an "excellent" or "good" job, 49% of Independents and 23% of Democrats say the same.
- Performance ratings for the Michigan Legislature trail both other metrics.
